### Associate to Full Professor, Psychometrics Department of Medical Social Sciences

The Department of Medical Social Sciences (MSS), Feinberg School of Medicine, Northwestern University is seeking an Associate/Full Professor of Psychometrics on the Team Science track, to be hired in FY 2022. MSS provides a unique scientific home for applied researchers who integrate biomedical and social science approaches to improve the health and health care delivery across the lifespan and across a broad range of health conditions (www.mss.northwestern.edu). MSS provides rich resources for conducting research including a broad scientific portfolio with multiple, large scale datasets, biostatistical and health informatics cores, expertise in multi-level assessment methods and serving as a collaborative bridge across Northwestern's campuses. MSS research is organized around four broad scientific hubs: Patient-centered Outcomes and Measurement Science, Health Equity, Lifespan Health Promotion, and Mechanisms of Health & Disease. This position would be based in the Patient-centered Outcomes and Measurement Science hub, but faculty would be encouraged to join other hubs aligned with their interest and expertise. MSS strongly encourages Black, Indigenous, people of color (BIPOC); transgender and non-binary people; sexual minorities; people with disabilities; and women to apply. We welcome everyone to join our department.

The MSS hub for Patient-centered Outcomes and Measurement Science is recruiting senior candidates with expertise in psychometric methods that are applicable to the behavioral and social sciences. In particular, we will be seeking candidates with an established program of research on item response theory (IRT) models, computer adaptive testing (CAT) algorithms, longitudinal modeling of items, or any related psychometric subfield that can inform the development, validation, or clinical integration of person-centered outcomes. We welcome applications from candidates with an extensive research record of psychometric analysis in any discipline, including education, psychology, cognitive science, and public health. Ideally, the candidate's research record will also demonstrate development and testing of new statistical models and novel algorithms, psychometric theory testing/development, and facility around programming in/of statistical software. An important consideration will be whether a candidate has a history or interest in serving as a mentor to junior psychometricians and scientists and whether he/she has broad enough expertise to provide informed and practical guidance for interdisciplinary work in applied health sciences. This is an outstanding opportunity for an experienced psychometrician seeking to join a vibrant research environment to lead, collaborate and mentor on high-impact measurement research and innovation.

The candidate should have demonstrated an innovative programmatic approach to his/her research, an outstanding record of scholarly publication and a history of extramural funding. MSS has a highly collaborative culture in which multiple investigators work in tandem on large-scale, team science research. Participation in departmental training activities and university service are also expected and valued. Salary will be commensurate with experience and credentials. Applications will be considered until the position is filled.
